3. REGISTRATION

Licenses: Only competitors and team officials with a valid IFSC international license are allowed to register for the competition.

Pre-registration: In order to support the efficient organisation of the competitions, it is very important that National Federations register participants to the competitions as early as possible.

Deadline: The deadline for registration is 15 days before the first day of competition (the "Registration Date") on **8 June 2021 at 11:59 PM UTC+0**.

Online Technical Meeting: (as per the Addendum to IFSC Rules)

A representative from each participating Member Federation shall participate to the online Technical meeting lead by the IFSC Technical Delegate.

4. PRE-EVENT REGULATIONS

All participating athletes, officials and organizing staff must submit a negative COVID-19 real-time-PCR test (taken no more than 72 hours prior to the arrival day) to the COVID-19 Delegate, Julia Pinggera at j.pinggera@austriaclimbing.com upon arrival/registration at the event.

All athletes and team officials are recommended to have insurance coverage, covering hospitalization and all other medical coverage if required due to COVID-19 and possible repatriation back to their home country. The IFSC will not be responsible for any of these costs.

5. CONFIRMATION OF ATTENDANCE (as per the Addendum to IFSC Rules)

Participation of all Team Members shall be confirmed upon arrival to location to the IFSC Technical Delegate by phone or via email in the 24 hours period between **20 June at 11:59 PM (UTC +2) and 21 June at 11:59 PM (UTC+2)**.

Confirmation of attendance and COVID-rapid-antigen-testing on site

Due to the currently changing legal situation with regards to sporting events in Austria, the testing-procedure is still being updated. All athletes, coaches and other people taking part in the competition will need to be tested regularly. When and where the tests are done will be communicated as soon as possible.

Covid-19 Regulations at the Kletterzentrum Innsbruck

Due to the legally restricted number of visitors at the Kletterzentrum Innsbruck (Climbing Gym Innsbruck), external team training and group events are, unfortunately, not possible at the moment. The competition areas (lead, boulder, speed) indoor and outdoor are mainly reserved for the national climbing team and the regional climbing team.

The following regulations apply to all visitors to the facility:

- Covid-19 Test for access
- FFP2 mask,
- 2 meter distance at any time,
- the ticket for climbing is valid for a maximum of 3 hours

11. RESPONSE PROTOCOL IN CASE OF POSITIVE RAPID TEST OR SUSPECTED CASE OF COVID-19

(Procedure as per April 2021)

The person suspected of being infected or having a positive Sars-Cov-2-Test result must be immediately placed in a separate room and kept away from the event. Also the direct contact persons of him/her need to be reported to the Health Department and, in case the local Health-Offices order it, kept away from the competition. To minimize risk, no one is to leave the competition area until health personnel arrive.

1. The contact details are to be kept ready
2. The organizer as well as the Covid19 Delegate and the COVID-19 Response Doctor (Dr. Johanna Rettenbacher) have to be informed immediately.
3. The responsible persons are obliged to contact the health advice immediately:

- c. Written notification of the suspected person incl. contact persons to:
corona-gesundheitsamt@innsbruck.gv.at
4. The contact persons (e.g. all members of the national team who have traveled together) are to be kept away from the event, if the health authorities order to do so. Direct contact persons need to be listed on the Covid-19 Health Check Form provided by the organizer.
5. The responsible persons immediately have to inform the parents/legal guardians or the coach on site of the affected person(s) in case of minors.
6. Further steps will be ordered by the locally responsible health authorities. Testing and similar measures are also carried out on the instructions of the health authorities. They also decide which persons must remain at the competition site for further clarification. As a rule, the person in question will be instructed to come to the Covid test lane (in a private car) where the smear test will be performed.
7. Documentation of which persons have or had contact with the affected person as well as the type of contact (e.g. with the help of participant lists and health check forms).
8. If a case of confirmed illness, further measures are taken in accordance with the instructions of the local health authority.

In order to be able to proceed in an appropriately ordered manner in the event of an incident, a room that is less frequented and can be well ventilated and disinfected will be selected in advance.

Furthermore, the contact details of all participants or their legal guardians must be available and participation in competition rounds must be documented (e.g. through participant lists, registration).

To make a safe and fast continuation of the event possible and in accordance with the current Addendum to IFSC Rules, the COVID-19 Response Doctor and the TD will be in contact about the (suspected) case and the further procedure.

APPENDIX I: TRAVEL INFORMATION

SUSPECTED TRAVEL RESTRICTIONS AT THE TIME OF THE COMPETITION

NOTE: Austria is currently changing the legal situation with regards to traveling.

If the travel regulations evolve the way they are planned, the following restrictions will be in place after May 19th:

Travel Restrictions in accordance with the ECDC-Covid-Chart

- Green / orange countries: free entry
- Red: Entry only with negative Covid-Test or vaccinated
- Dark red: Entry only with negative Covid-Test / vaccinated + with 10-day-Quarantine (except for business travelers)
- For countries outside of Europe: no eased travel restrictions have yet been published, hence the current travel regulations will stay in place for outside-Europe countries.

As the situation is still uncertain, you can find below the travel restrictions that are valid at the moment, until May 19th. An update will be given at the End of May. For outside-Europe countries it is likely that the restrictions below will still be valid in June.

CURRENT TRAVEL RESTRICTIONS

The following information was written on April 29th according to the Covid-19 restrictions valid at this time and is provided without guarantee of legal accuracy.

Please be sure to check your home country's travel warnings in addition to Austrian regulations.

For business travelers these documents are necessary to enter Austria without going to quarantine:

- **Requirement 1: Pre-Travel Clearance**
 - o Filled out Pre-Travel-Clearance Form: <https://entry.ptc.gv.at/en.html>.
This document is available in English or German. Every person entering the country needs to fill out this form. Business traveling count as the exemption according to § 4(3) or § 5(5) – So the last check box needs to be ticked on this form.
- **Requirement 2: Negative COVID Test**
 - o Negative Sars-Cov-2 Test (Antigen or PCR Test) not older than 72 or 48 hours at the time of entry. The certificate of this negative test needs to be written in German or English language.
 - o Please check the requirements specifically for entering from your home country!
- **Requirement 3: Confirmation of work purpose**
 - o Confirmation that the journey is for business purpose (National Federations can receive such confirmation from the local Ministry of Sports or other offices in charge in the respective country or can write their own confirmation for their athletes).

General Current Situation and Rules in Austria (29th of April 2021):

- Usually, it is necessary to do a 10-day quarantine when entering Austria (the quarantine can be ended with a negative PCR-Test or Antigen-Test on the 5th day of quarantine)
- However, there are exceptions for EU-citizens, as well as citizens from other states and territories, regarding quarantine for persons entering for work purposes.
 - o All athletes taking part in elite sport events are business travellers (Travel Allowance required from your National Ministry of Sports and/or the National Federation).
 - o Further information / necessary travel documents for business travelers can be found above
- Landing bans are currently in place for flights from South Africa, Brazil and India
- Hotels are closed to leisure travelers/tourists and Restaurants and bars can only offer takeout/delivery services.
- You are required to keep a minimum distance of 2 meter (6.5 ft) to people from other households.
- FFP2-masks need to be worn in all indoor facilities and also outdoors if the 2 meter distance cannot be kept.

In addition to the confirmation from your country (from official bodies or the National Federation) you can receive a **Confirmation Letter from Austria Climbing** upon request. Note: this is only an additional document and it does not replace the confirmation that you are traveling for business.
